She will discuss "Employee Centric Culture," including experiences and best practices cultivating a vibrant employee-centric culture and ways to strengthen connections with employees, customers and community.

ago. She and her partners have restored it to profitability. Stephanie's topic, "Doing More With Less," explores how operators of all sizes can win on the C-Store shelf, including maximizing a limited budget to enhance visibility, consumer engagement, and overall success.

Amy explores "The Next Generation of Convenience Store Formats," synthesizing insights from discussions with retailers to identify key trends, assessing the development of convenience store models and their historical roots, and differentiating emerging new models in convenience retailing that are redefining the concept of convenience beyond fuel-centric options.
